<b>Data Tracking &amp; Monitoring</b>	<b>55,626</b>	
Senior Leadership	29,328	Leadership ensures teaching in all year groups focuses on tracking, raising attainment and attendance in all year groups. The school continually reviews the number of teachers and class sizes to narrow the P8 gap further.
Data Management	26,298	The School has invested in a Data Manager to develop systems and closely track the progress of the Pupil Premium group and other key groups.
<b>Attendance &amp; Accessibility</b>	<b>51,912</b>	
Welfare Officer	27,912	The School employs an Attendance Officer and a Pupil-Welfare Officer who can make home visits to support pupils who are at risk of falling below 90% attendance.
Rewards	4,000	The school offers incentives for students to achieve improved attendance and attitude to learning.
Alternative Education	20,000	The school provides an off-site intervention to ensure students stay engaged in education and avoid exclusion.
<b>Pastoral Support</b>	<b>88,439</b>	
Pastoral Support Team	58,439	The School employs a pastoral support team to implement programmes which are targeted at students with specific behavioral/emotional issues.
Mentor	18,000	Mentoring is being used in the school for disadvantaged pupils, aiming to build confidence, or to develop resilience and character. Although it doesn't directly focus on teaching or tutoring specific skills, evidence shows that it does improve educational outcomes.

Counsellor	12,000	The School employs counsellors who offer 1:1 coaching and tailor their interventions to the specific social or emotional needs of the pupils
<b>Curriculum Support &amp; Inclusion</b>	<b>61,909</b>	
Small Group Intevention	49,909	The School provides additional tuition delivered by trained teachers, linked with normal teaching.
DT materials	2,000	The school provides and subsidises materials and ingredients to enable pupil premium students to access the curriculum.
Trips	1,000	Cultural and enrichment activities and trips; the school will fully subsidise trips that wholly support the curriculum and will part subsidise other extra-curricular activities that promote the social and educational development of pupils.
Music	500	The school offers subsidies to disadvantaged pupils to encourage their participation in art and music activities (e.g. music tuition).
Misc	8,500	Funding was used to provide additional tuition; additional materials, resources and staff to support academic enhancement activities as well as the interventions listed above.
