# Organisation

- It has been made clear exams are scheduled to go ahead as normal
- However, it has also made clear all centres need to have a “plan B”
- This should include at least 3 assessment points, 1 in the autumn term (November mocks), 1 in the spring term (March mocks) and 1 in the summer term
- These assessments would then provide a portfolio of evidence that would support the determination of a CDG should the exams not go ahead or should individual students be forced to miss an exam for reasons related to COVID

# Organisation

- November mocks are therefore now essential for two reasons:
  - It will give you and your teachers a clear picture of any gaps in knowledge and understanding as you prepare for the summer exams
  - They may be used as part of a portfolio of evidence should exams not go ahead or should individual students be unable to sit all papers due to isolating

# Organisation

- In February, exam boards will provide topic lists to help you focus your revision, formula sheets will also be provided
- It is not yet clear how much detail these topic lists and formula sheets will have
- Each subject will provide a breakdown of topics that could be assessed in each paper and formula sheets will be provided in maths and science

# Organisation

- The timetable will be collapsed from Monday 15<sup>th</sup> November to Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> November
- Friday 26<sup>th</sup> November (INSET day) will be used as a catch up day for any exams unavoidably missed
- Monday 29<sup>th</sup> November INSET day
- Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> November lessons resume as normal

# Organisation

- You will only have to attend for exams
- When not in an exam, you can either study at home or if you or your parents prefer, you can work in independent study rooms at school
- If you are not thought to be using your time effectively at home, you will be expected to study at school full time

# Organisation

- Access on and off of site during the day will be via the BACK GATE only
- The gate will open 10 mins prior to the meet time and will remain open for 10 mins after the end of an exam
- If you fail to leave the site during these times, once the gate is locked you will be expected to remain on site and work in the independent study room



# Organisation

- Exams will take place in the hall, gym and student support centre
- Students with any form of dispensation (reader, extra time, use of word processor), will sit exams in the student support centre
- All extra time will run in full - exams in the afternoon will often finish after the end of the school day
- A timetable of exact timings will be given out after half term
- There are also a small number of students with exam clashes, individual timetables will be issued to those students

# Organisation

- All students are expected to arrive with all necessary equipment - this includes a ruler that can be used to measure accurately!
- Calculators and specialist maths equipment will be provided where appropriate
- Water bottles must be clear plastic with no labels
- You must make sure you have NO NOTES or paper in your pockets

# Mobile Phones & Watches

- ALL watches now come under the same category as mobile phones: they MUST NOT under any circumstances be taken into the exam room
- Watches and mobile phones will not be collected in, they should wherever possible be left at home
- If brought in to school, they should be turned off and placed in bags which should be put into the locked cages
- Any items brought in to school are your responsibility

# Attendance

- You must attend every exam on time
- If you have an unavoidable known absence, you must let Mrs Pitt know as soon as possible
- Unless you have COVID related symptoms, you will be expected to attend in the same way as you will in the summer
- Should you miss an exam for any reason, you are expected to sit that exam in the next exam slot, that afternoon or the following morning
- There are additional catch up sessions timetabled, including Friday 26<sup>th</sup> November
