






Exam preparation




Library news

Year 11 Nutritionist Q&A

On Monday, 9th January, after school, 14 year 11 students attended a talk delivered by a local nutritional therapist, Natasha Draycott. Students asked questions to help them with their food preparation and nutrition NEA work where they are having to come up with menus for a cafe that are innovative, nutritious and using seasonal produce. Students also asked questions about current nutritional guidelines, cooking for vegans, how household budgets are going to affect a families' nutrition and if seasonal foods are more nutritious.

This valuable primary research will now be used by them to help make their final menu choices. One student, who wants to make chocolate brownies, was advised to try out adding sweet potato and reducing the sugar content to improve the nutritional value of the dish.

It is great to get professionals from our local community into the classroom to educate our students and learn about careers open to them if they wish to continue with an interest in food and diet. Miss Fry

We have already run groups through the last year which have proved really successful and parents/carers' have given us amazing feedback on how helpful, informative and supportive they have found the course. The group is designed to inform and support parents, helping them to understand their child's distress and discover effective strategies to improve their resilience. The group is also an opportunity for parents going through similar experiences to encourage, support and learn from each other in a safe and friendly environment.

Cold Weather Preparation

Although spring is just around the corner it is possible that cold temperatures may continue so can we continue to please ask that students wear a coat over their uniform, on the journey to and from school. As mentioned in previous issues, this is also a good idea for wet weather when students may still be outside during the school day.

Parking

We have received some comments from local residents about parents/carers blocking drives when picking up/dropping off children near to school. We are also concerned that some parking is blocking cycle lanes and forcing students into the road. Can we take this opportunity to remind you of the need to adhere to highway regulations and respect the local community when you are driving to and from our school and to be considerate of cyclists when parking near to the school.

Exam Invigilators

Duties will include supervising pupils taking exams, supervising clash candidates between exam sittings, preparing exam rooms, distributing and collecting exam papers in accordance with the JCQ regulations. This is a casual contract and working hours will be negotiated for each exam period. Hourly rate is ± 10.60
