Pathways

- Four pathways designed to
- Provide access to appropriate subjects and levels of support
- Increase the chances of achieving the best overall grades possible
- Increase the opportunities to progress beyond year 11
- Recommendations made for each pathway are recommendations and any concerns are open to discussion



- Pathway 1: Students recommended to continue with an MFL as well as choosing either history or geography therefore fulfilling the full EBACC requirements
- Pathway 2: Students recommended to choose either history or geography as their EBACC subject rather than a language
- Pathway 3: Students recommended choose geography as their EBACC option
- Pathway 4: A very small number of students with specific individual needs. Students in this pathway will be contacted by the SEN department regarding their options



- English language & literature, mathematics, science, history OR geography, AND a modern foreign language (French or Spanish)
- Not compulsory
- Not an additional qualification
- These are useful access subjects if you think you want to do A levels or go on to university
- They are a good academic foundation, especially if you are unsure of what you want to do



- Many are now 100% exam
- Practical subjects still have an element of practically assessed work (NEA)
- All will follow the new grading 9-1

BTEC & Vocational Subjects

- Vocational (work related, more practically based)
- ALL have an externally moderated element, most of which is an exam worth 40%
- L1/L2 Pass, Merit or Distinction, rather than 9 1
- Does allow entry onto BTEC level 3
- New format of these courses mean attendance at every lesson is critical. Class notes can be taken into assessments, gaps in notes will significantly impact outcomes

- Choices must include at least ONE subject from the EBACC group of subjects, for all students in pathways 1,2&3. This can be in any block
- Students in pathway 1 are strongly recommended to choose an MFL subject as well as either history or geography



- Students in pathway 3 are strongly recommended to choose geography as their EBACC subject
- Students in pathway 3 who are currently following the PDP curriculum, are strongly recommended to choose PSE as one of their options
- CANNOT choose Art and Textiles without prior agreement from Miss King and Mrs Pitt
- MUST BE PREPARED TO DO RESERVE CHOICES
- Form must be signed by adult at home

- Join the live question & answer presentations that are scheduled over the next 5 evenings
- Talk to your tutor and your subject teachers over the next three weeks
